Lesson 10: Irregular Plural Nouns

LEARN

Some nouns have irregular plurals. In most cases the spelling of the singular noun changes to form the plural.

SINGULAR PLURAL	man men	woman women	child children	tooth teeth
SINGULAR	foot	goose	mouse	ox
PLURAL	feet	geese	mice	oxen

In a few cases the plural noun and the singular noun are the same.

SINGULAR	One deer nibbles the grass.		
PLURAL	Three deer stand and watch.		
SINGULAR	This sheep is white.		

The other two **sheep** are brown.

A **moose** swam across the lake.

Singular A moose swam across the lake.

Several moose live on the island.
