LEARN

A fragment is an incomplete sentence. The subject or predicate might be missing. To correct this kind of fragment, add a subject or a predicate.

FRAGMENT Bought a children's book.

My sister bought a children's book.

Add a subject.

FRAGMENT The book.

SENTENCE The book is for my brother.

Add a predicate.

A run-on sentence is two complete sentences that run together. One way to correct a run-on sentence is to make two separate sentences. Another way is to make a compound sentence.

RUN-ON

She likes to draw she wants to be an artist.

CORRECTED SENTENCE

She likes to draw. She wants to be an artist.

CORRECTED SENTENCE

She likes to draw, and she wants to be an artist.
